Science Day

On Thursday 22nd March, we will be holding the annual Science Day at Carpenters. This will involve all children from Nursery to Year 6. The children will be taking part in science related activities all day including workshops and investigations. It would be really good to see the children dress up in science related costumes. This could be 'Mad Scientists' in white coats or something studied in science such as a magnet or butterfly. Let your imagination run wild!
 In addition, we are looking for any parents/carers who have jobs which use science who wouldn't mind coming into class to talk to the children about their work. Jobs might include, but not be limited to: nurses, builders, engineers, doctors, park rangers, chemists, drivers, etc. This doesn't need to be for science day but any time in the summer term. The objective is to make the children aware of science all around them in the real world. If you think you could do this, let your child's class teacher know.

Safeguarding - Injuries

Over the last couple of weeks, a number of children have arrived at school with injuries following accidents both in and out of school. In order to be able to support these children, it is really important that the school is informed. If your child suffers an injury, please inform either the class teacher, a member of the leadership team on duty or the school office of the injury, how it was sustained and what adjustments we may need to make (e.g. keeping them in at playtime or using an adult to scribe for them). As a school, it is our duty to ensure children are kept safe from harm. As a result, if a child arrives at school with an injury that hasn't been explained to us in advance, even something as small as a bruise on the face, we will speak to the child before contacting the parent/carer to clarify the situation. As always your support in this matter is very much appreciated.
