Aim

This week we will be writing an information text.

Along with any knowledge you and your family may have on the subject, write an explanation of what Ramadan is and how people mark this holy period.

Task

Red group: Write at least 2 paragraphs which explain what Ramadan is and what people do during this time.

Green group: Write an information text of at least 4 paragraphs explaining all you have found out about Ramadan and what people who celebrate this time do during this time. It may look something like this:

Paragraph 1 - Introduction: what is Ramadan?

Paragraph 2 - When is Ramadan and how do people celebrate over the world?

Paragraph 3- What is fasting?

Paragraph 4 - What happens at the end of Ramadan?

Paragraph 5 - Conclusion - summarise why it is a special time.

Blue group: Write a diary entry from the point of view of a person who is observing Ramadan, writing in 1st person throughout.
